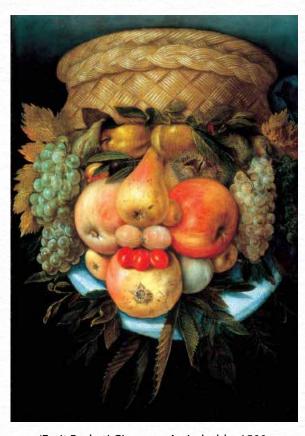
## Our Inspiration!
