

Student Visa – guide to online application form For students applying outside the UK



Before you start your visa form:

- 1. To access your visa application form, you will be emailed a direct link to your form during the registration process. This is the only way you can access your form so keep this email in a place you can easily find it again.
- 2. You can save your form and return to it later.
- 3. Once you digitally sign the Declaration, you cannot make any changes to your answers.
- 4. If you want your visa application form and documents checked, you must stop at the Declaration stage. Do not go past this point as any mistakes that an adviser finds cannot be fixed. If the mistakes are significant, you may need to cancel your visa application and request a refund which can take several weeks. You then need to start a new form and make your application again.
- 5. You should only pay for your visa application when you meet the financial requirements as these requirements must be met on the day you pay the application fee, not the date of your biometric enrolment.
- 6. One of the main reason that a student visa application is refused is that the applicant has not understood the financial requirements. Read through our <u>guides</u> so that you understand how the visa process works and the types of documents you will need.
