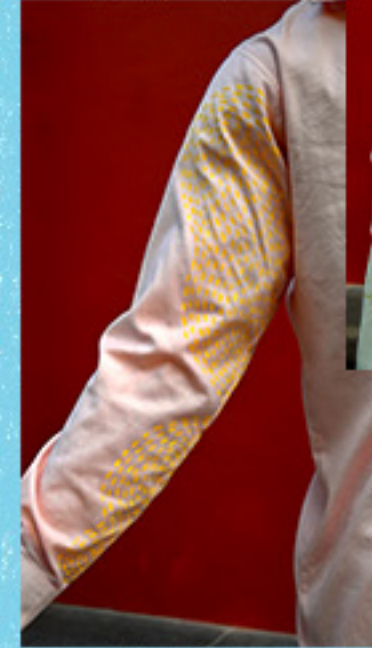


Hi I'm Rishi, I have a label where we make hand painted up-cycled conceptual wearable art, each piece is a unique storyteller and is made only once.

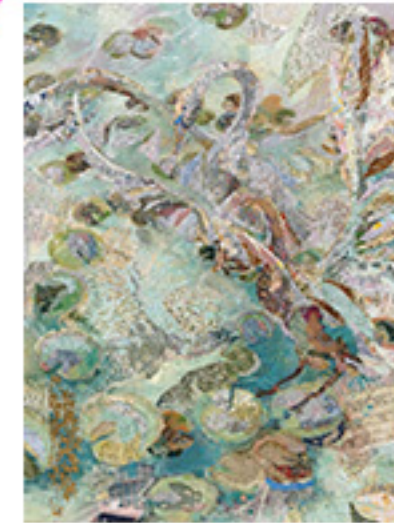
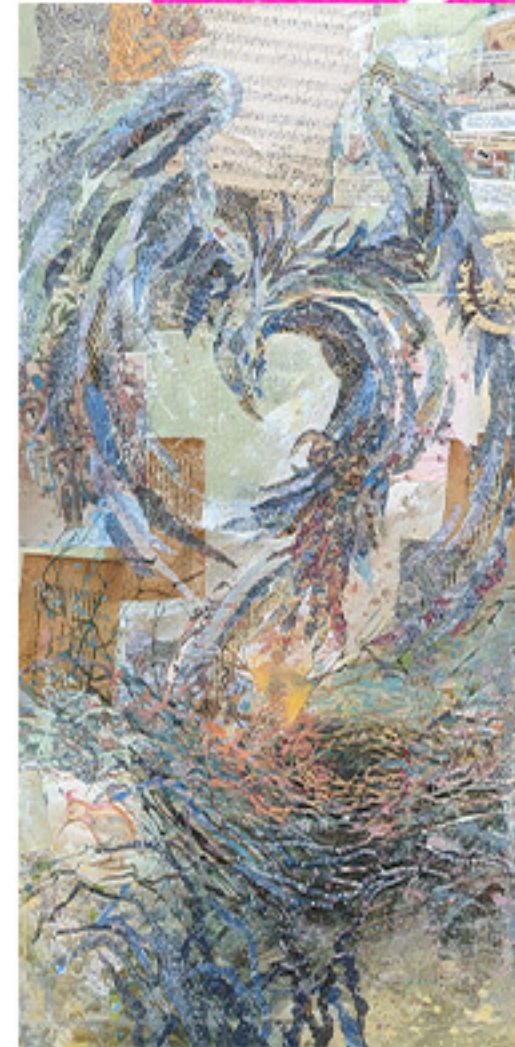
The artist was born in the Central Asian country of Kazakhstan, part of the former USSR. She studied not only visual art, but also music, dance, and architecture academically. This varied and diverse education provided her with a synesthetic understanding, developing her capacity to translate music into visuals and movement, as all these forms of expressions are animated, in her view, by the same energy source. Inessa has called Singapore home for the last 18 years.

At the time the educational model in Kazakhstan was the Russian one, with a big stress on technique, versus concept. The artist had the chance to focus on the conceptual aspect of her practice at a later time, when she enrolled in the prestigious art college Central Saint Martins in London. This opened up the artist to a variety of expressive possibilities. She complemented her artistic studies in Oxford, where she learned about the nitty-gritty of building herself as an artist within the art system.

She has written, illustrated and self-published nine books and contributed writing to the German National Library's 'House of Europe' book (2020), 'The Other Side: An Emotional Map of Britain' by GraphicDesign& (2020) and 'Ways of Protest', by Round Lemon' (2020).

She has written and performed protest songs at events across Europe, including 'The Right to Vote' exhibition opening at the National Justice Museum, UK (2018), Glastonbury Festival, UK (2019), Aachen Town Hall (2022), the European Parliament (2023) and Stormont, NI Assembly (2024).

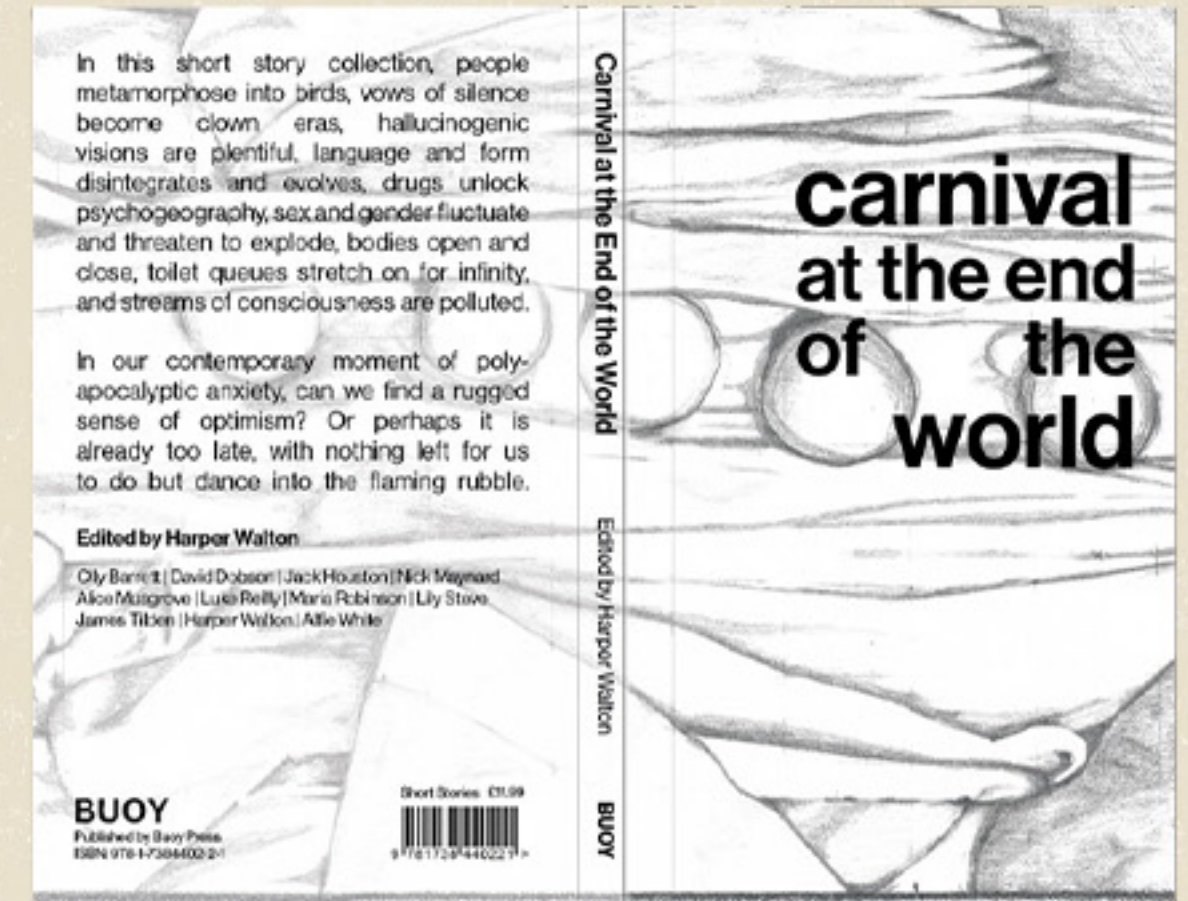

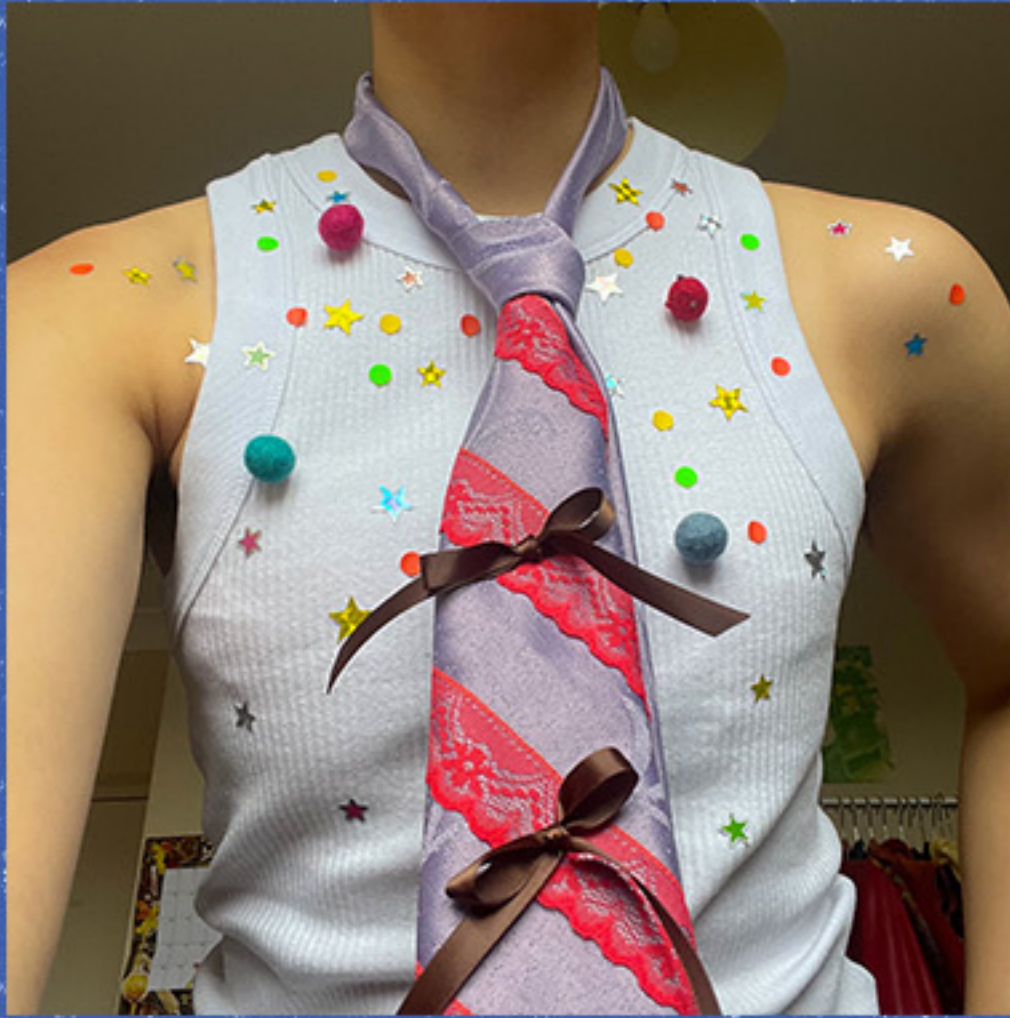

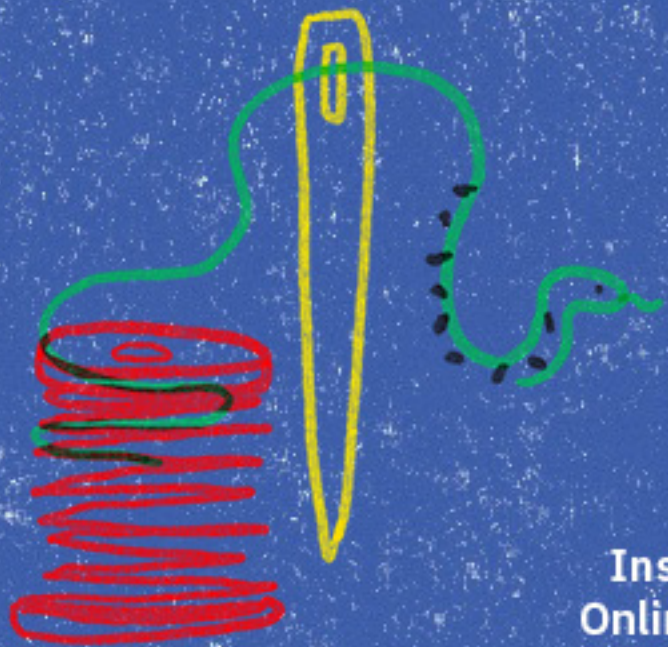
